Douglas A. Hicks is professor of leadership studies and religion at the University of Richmond in Richmond, Virginia. An ordained Presbyterian minister, he was educated at Davidson College (B.A. in economics), Duke University Divinity School (M.Div.), and Harvard University (PhD in religion, ethics and economics). He has written extensively on the moral challenges of economic life (among other topics). Among the books he has published are *Inequality and Christian Ethics* (Cambridge 2000), *Religion and the Workplace* (Cambridge 2003), *Global Neighbors* (co-edited with Mark Valeri) (Eerdmans, 2008), and *Money Enough--Everyday Practices of Living Faithfully in the Global Economy* (Jossey-Bass, 2010)

D. Jeffrey Lenn is Associate Vice-President for Academic Operations and Professor of Strategic Management and Public Policy at George Washington University. He was educated at the University of Pennsylvania (B.A. in economics), Andover Newton Theological School (M.Div.), Yale University (S.T. M.), and Boston College (Ph.D.) His research and teaching focus on strategic management, business and public policy, and business ethics. He has served as a consultant to corporations, government agencies and non-profit organizations. An ordained elder, he is a member of the Old Presbyterian Meeting House in Alexandria, Virginia.

Skip Ferguson is the pastor of the Manassas (Va.) Presbyterian Church.
