A graduate of Yale University and Princeton Seminary, he did his doctoral work at Cambridge University in England. A Reformation scholar who has written extensively on the history of the Reformed tradition, he is also interested in the impact of globalization on Christian missions, and one of his current projects is a book on the Christian response to the challenge of human trafficking.
